Advocating for high quality supports, programs, and services that improve the lives of our community is key to our mission. Members participated in an online seminar to advocate for Katie's Law, which strikes outdated and hurtful terminology in documents. They also raised funds through events such as Hip Hop Café. Their fundraising efforts not only support advocacy initiatives, but also projects such as scholarships for educational courses and exercise opportunities for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities. While the pandemic has caused disruptions, empowering our staff and the people we serve through continued employment has been a top priority. Our direct care staff have done a tremendous job, and in January we were able to provide significant wage increases to all our staff. But that is not enough—we must continue to do more to support these essential employees and we will through support such as yours. The Lifeworks employment programs in Norwood and Boston continue to provide training and job supervision to the people we serve. One notable success story is Noah who works for Shaw's Supermarket.
